

# Part M Effective Mar 2020 - For Large Aircraft - 2 Days

### Introduction

Commission Regulation EU 1321/2014 Annex I (Part-M) as amended by Commission Implementing Regulations (EU) 2020/270, (EU) 2019/1384, Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/1383

Specifies that an aircraft owner or operator is responsible for the continuing airworthiness of its aircraft.

Part M focuses on the specific obligations of the Continuous Airworthiness Management Organisation (CAMO) to manage the Airworthiness Process.

Subpart I identifies the specific obligation to ensure the Airworthiness of the aircraft through the performance of the Airworthiness Review Certificate (ARC) process.

The primary purpose of this training is to provide a thorough understanding of the Role of Part M Specifically to complement the requirements of EASA Part CAMO.

To provide a general overview of all parts of Part M and to provide in detail an in-depth understanding of Subparts C and I;
