

Republic of Indonesia DGCA Stores & Receiving Inspection Procedures – 2 Days

Introduction

The Republic of Indonesia DGCA receiving inspection system for aircraft parts and material aims to establish traceability, and that parts were designed and manufactured in accordance with CASR Part 21; produced to established industry standards, and, were previously determined to be airworthy under CASR Part 43.

For an Air Carrier or Approved Maintenance Organization to ensure these requirements are met, requires personnel to be trained to acquire adequate knowledge to reduce the risk of allowing unairworthy parts to enter into the aeronautical supply chain system and maintain compliance.

The Republic of Indonesia DGCA Civil Aviation Safety Regulations that drive the receiving inspection and stores distribution system, and relevant guidance material includes aircraft identification marking, certification, and maintenance.

This comprehensive 2-day training course provides Air Carriers, Approved Maintenance Organizations, and Manufacturers with detailed guidance on how to establish an enhanced receiving inspection system to help eliminate the safety risk posed by unairworthy articles, parts, or materials.

Attending this training will place organizations in the best position to ensure that articles being purchased as new or returned to service after maintenance conform to type design, or specifications and meet airworthiness requirements.

Who is the course for?

The course is for personnel involved in store management and receiving inspection procedures within the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) in the Republic of Indonesia. It aims to provide participants with the necessary knowledge and skills to effectively manage aviation stores, perform receiving inspections, and ensure compliance with regulatory requirements, enhancing safety and efficiency in aviation operations.

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What is the Benefit of this Training - What will I learn?

- a) Awareness of the Republic of Indonesia DGCA Civil Aviation Safety Regulations relevant to Aviation Stores and Receiving Inspection system.
- b) An understanding of the differences between approved parts, accepted parts, OEM, and PMA parts.
- c) The ability to recognize discrepancies in receiving documentation.
- d) An in-depth understanding of how to determine traceability of received parts and material, and their eligibility to be installed on aircraft.
- e) Knowledge of Production Approval Holder (PAH) requirements and responsibilities related to the certification of parts.
- f) Best practices to develop a receiving inspection system including developing procedures.
- g) The precautions that must be taken to reduce the possibility of damage when handling Electro Static Discharge Sensitive (ESDS) products.
- h) How to correctly dispose of scrap and unsalvageable parts and materials to ensure they will not be allowed to reenter the supply chain.
- i) An understanding of how to train, qualify and assess the competence of receiving inspection personnel.
- j) A deep understanding of Suspected Unapproved Parts (SUP), tips to identify them, and how to report them to the authority once they have been detected.
- k) Key elements to be considered for developing an effective audit program for the Aviation Stores environment.
